

## D12 Draft catalogue on child-appealing appliances

Atlas for Household Appliances – child appealing designs

*as circulated to delegates in advance of the meeting*

### 1 Objective

To establish an operational practical frame to assist the uniform discrimination between normal electric household appliances and household appliances with a child appealing design, that are subjected to the Low Voltage Directive 2006/95/EC and sold on the European market.

### 2 Origin

#### 2.1 Legal background

- **Low Voltage Directive 2006/95/EC:** this directive imposes compliance with several essential safety requirements: the conformity to the relevant Cenelec harmonised standards presumes compliance with the essential safety requirements. This Directive will be changed to bring it in line with the New Legislative Framework (“NLF” - Omnibus procedure).
- **Harmonised standard EN 60335-1:** This standard is applicable to Household and similar electrical appliances – Safety – Part 1: General requirements.
- **Harmonised standard EN 60335-2-xx:** This standard is applicable to Household and similar electrical appliances – Safety – Part 2-2: Particular requirements for xx (every part deals with a separate product group within the group of electrical household appliances).
- **LVD ADCO Recommendation November 2008:** This recommendation is applicable to child appealing appliances which was published on the Commission website (EUROPEAN COMMISSION, ENTERPRISE AND INDUSTRY DIRECTORATE-GENERAL, New Approach Industries, Tourism and CSR, Mechanical, Electrical and Telecom Equipment Secretariat LVD Working Party, Brussels, 15 June 2009, (14)04 ADCO Recommendation on Child appealing appliances.doc, LVDWP/14/4.)
